

A New Beginning Through CalAIM

Thanks to the CalAIM program and dedicated case management, one of our clients successfully moved into stable housing. They received help with their deposit and first month's rent, and with support from Anthem and our supportive housing team, their home was fully furnished within two months using gently used items and community referrals.

CalAIM (California Advancing and Innovating Medi-Cal) is a statewide effort that provides extra support and care coordination for people with complex needs.

The family keeps in touch with their case manager, receiving ongoing support and food assistance as needed. "I'm so grateful for everything. I finally feel like I have a place to call home," they shared. We're proud to support their journey to stability.
